• Arizona Early Childhood Education Workforce Registry

This registry will help individuals on the career path toward early childhood education. By joining this registry, candidates can Access First Things First College Scholarships to take college classes toward a degree or credential in early childhood, now only available through the Registry.

• University of Arizona – Fellows Pathway to Teaching

What makes the fellowship experience different? For one, districts select and interview candidates to name as fellows, and then if a student is selected, they fulfill their student teaching and field experience requirements in that district as part of the district community or the 'Fellows family.' Secondly, it affords students a step-up as a job seeker in that district and they will be especially recognized for being a fellow.

- ➤ Applications are accepted December 20 March 1 each year.
- Tuition may be covered through a combination of forgivable loans and scholarships such as Arizona Teachers Academy.
- Financial Support offered
 - Receive a \$1,000 stipend at the start of Fellows program
 - Receive a \$1,000 stipend at the start of student teaching,
 - Receive \$400 stipend at mid-point of student teaching, and
 - Receive \$400 stipend at successful completion of student teaching.

• University of Arizona - Pathways to Teaching

Pathways to Teaching is a new, innovative College of Education Teacher Preparation Program that seeks to "grow our own" teachers by supporting district partner-area residents in earning a bachelor's degree in elementary education with an ESL endorsement.

- > Earn a bachelor's degree with an English as a Second Language endorsement
- Full tuition covered through the Arizona Teachers Academy. Total estimated out-of-pocket cost is only \$456.95 throughout the program.
- > Receive a \$1,000 monthly stipend so you can focus on becoming the best teacher possible
- > 17-month program that starts in January and graduates in May the next year. Add an additional year for special education certification.
